



Regulations of a mass event site

I. General information

- 1. The event site is managed by the University of Lodz and the Medical University of Lodz.
- 2. The organisation of a mass event shall take place in accordance with the Act of 20 March 2009, on safety of mass events (Journal of Laws No. 62, item 504).
- 3. The mass event site is open to all individuals at the age of majority.
- 4. The site is secured in accordance with safety standards to ensure the safety of event participants, as long as it is used for its intended purpose.
- 5. Ensuring order and safety for participants is contingent upon adherence to the Regulations outlined herein and compliance with the law.
- 6. During the mass event, the entire site provided is covered by CCTV video monitoring.

Organisational and order rules at the event site

II. The right of entry to the organised event is vested in:

1. All individuals at the age of majority.

III. Entry of vehicles to the event site

Private vehicles are entirely prohibited to enter the site, except for service vehicles (marked) that are authorized to enter the site for the purpose of performing their statutory duties. Entry to the service car park shall only take place on the basis of a named permit issued by the organiser.

IV.Safety rules

- 1. In the Regulations, the event organiser defines the detailed rules of entry and stay at the event.
- 2. A participant is required to undergo security inspection upon entering the event site, as outlined in these Regulations.
- 3. Participants are prohibited from bringing items to the venue that may pose an immediate danger to the safety of other participants, such as firearms or gas weapons, stun guns, gas throwers, knives, clubs, chains, firecrackers, smoke candles, lasers, and other similar items that could be used as projectiles.
- 4. Alcoholic beverages, drugs, as well as glass, metal, plastic, and cardboard packaging are prohibited from being brought onto the venue.
- 5. The use of open flames is prohibited.
- The display of banners or placards without permission from the organisers, and the use of vulgar or insulting language that violates good morals is not allowed.
- 7. Bringing and having sports club colours, graphics, symbols, etc. is not welcomed.

- Bringing dogs and cats or other animals into the event site is prohibited.
 This prohibition does not apply to guide dogs.
- 9. Bringing bicycles, motorbikes and other similar single and multi-track vehicles into the event site is prohibited.
- 10. Individuals who fail to comply with these Regulations, or disobey the instructions given by the security and information services, may be expelled from the event site.
- 11. All stage design and advertising elements used must be made of certified flame-retardant materials.
- 12. Stage design elements or advertising materials that have not been approved, or are in an inappropriate location and do not comply with fire regulations, will be removed at the expense of the owner.
- 13. All employees working at the event must be aware of the location of hand-held firefighting equipment and the procedures to follow in case of a fire.

NOTE!

- 14. The organiser has the right to record the course of the mass event, including the behaviour of participants, using audio and video recording equipment.
- 15. The organiser's marked services, displaying visible badges, are responsible for ensuring security and maintaining law and order at the mass event.

These services are entitled to:

- a) Verify the authorization to be present on the premises of the mass event.
- b) Check identity of any person.
- c) Inspect the contents of individuals' luggage, clothing in the event of suspicion that they bring to the event objects referred to in items IV 3 and 4 of the Regulations.
- d) Request that individuals leave the mass event if they violate the provisions outlined in these Regulations.
- e) Remove and immediately hand over to the Police any individuals posing a direct threat to human life, health, as well as protected property.
- f) Remove individuals from the event site whose behaviour disrupts the event.
- g) Refuse access to the mass event of all individuals refusing to engage in the activities referred to in item IV 2 of the Regulations.
- 16. The organiser of the mass event reserves the right to make civil law claims for compensation for any damage caused on the premises from individuals who caused or contributed to such damage.
- 17. In the event of disputes not governed by these Regulations, the provisions of the Civil Code shall apply.
